The team in Israel continues to help provide food and supplies to the security forces in Northern Israel as we start the groundwork for a new work in the Middle East. Friend Ships Director Teri Shields is traveling to Israel to find us a facility in the village of Sderot, in the south of the country and to meet with authorities there. Sderot is less than a mile from the Gaza Strip and was our home for two years while we established a medical camp in Gaza in 2019-2021. For years, our village of Sderot has been the target of regular rocket fire from Hamas as alarms sound sometimes daily or even hourly and people run for shelter. Then on October 7th, it became the site of brutal attacks by hundreds of terrorists. Many people were murdered or kidnapped along with twenty police officers as the terrorists violently overtook the police station. Since then, the village has continued to be the constant target of rocket fire. Most of its population were forced to evacuate. The Lord is leading us to re-establish a base in Sderot and work with local authorities to prepare for the return of its residents, helping them through this most difficult time. As opportunities arise, we also hope to provide medical, food and other aid to Gazans in near-by communities as they return to their homes. This will be a time of recovery from tremendous heartbreak on both sides of the border. We are ready to do whatever we can to help, in the Name of Jesus.
